Professor Mohammad Bolhassani PhD is part of a team <u>selected to receive \$2.4 million in</u> <u>funding from the Advanced Research Projects</u> <u>Agency – Energy (ARPA-E) of the U.S.</u> <u>Department of Energy.</u> The objective of the research project, part of HESTIA (*Harnessing Emissions into Structures Taking Input from the Atmosphere*), is to investigate technologies for the transformation of traditional structures into net carbon storage structures. Professor Zihao Zhang was nominated as an early career fellow of the Dean's Equity and Inclusion Initiative (DEII). Together with 16 other early career faculty, Zhang was recently welcomed into the second cohort of this scholarly development program.
