





The CCNY campus buildings are designated "PRIVATE SPACE." Please have your validated CCNY ID handy; it is required for entry.



There is no plan to disclose information to outsiders without them having the legal means to compel disclosure from City College.

The Immigrant Student Center, in NAC 6/204, is a crucial resource for students.

Angelo Cabrera will be the Director of the Immigrant Student Center, starting February 10th. Angelo, once an undocumented student, has dedicated his career to supporting migrants by providing access to educational opportunities, legal support, and financial resources.

Under Angelo's leadership, the center will offer comprehensive support including financial aid application assistance, fostering community belonging, and connecting our students to legal services, mental health resources, and emergency financial support. He will keep immigrant students informed about evolving immigration policies and offer "knowing your rights" sessions to empower them further.

Still Making Space for Gender, centers women and LGBTQIA+ folk in the built environment. While the discourse framing gender morphs and gender identities broaden and become more intersectional, the predicament remains the same. Women and LGBTQIA+ folk continue to struggle against exploitation and fight for equal rights and equity in opportunities in the United States, with this situation troubling unrelenting claims of exceptionalism at home and abroad. Although gender politics are ever present, achievements are hard-won and sometimes rolled back in the face of misogyny, homophobia, transphobia, and other ingrained expressions of exclusion. Buildings, cities, and landscapes are not only where battles over gender unfurl, but these spaces also foster identities and incite change. In this lecture series, trailblazing women and LGBTQIA+ design practitioners, scholars, and activists—working in architecture, landscape architecture, and urban design—insist that gender must remain in sharp focus if we are to shape equitable and just built environments.



This series was initiated by the late Michael Sorkin, distinguished professor of architecture and director of the Urban Design Program at the Spitzer School, and curated by him for eleven years.



Led the profound transformation of the Urban Design Program at the Spitzer School of Architecture, steering the school away from trends, styles, and disciplinary silos and toward a deeply poly-symphonic mission of creating new, equitable, beautiful, and sustainable forms and technologies for the city and urbanity at large

Produced a prodigious output of essays, lectures, and designs, all promoting social justice, which established him as the political conscience in the field

Through his practice and teaching, showed us that the city is part of larger ecological and social systems that contribute so much toward equanimity and sheer pleasure




