G. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURE

1. *Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:*
When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by

representatives from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons/program coordinators.

2. *Procedures for evaluation agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:*

Each semester, City College of New York will provide Borough of Manhattan Community College (BMCC) with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.


3. *Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.:*

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the Borough of Manhattan Community College website and on The City College of New York College's website. Transfer advisors at Borough of Manhattan Community College will promote this agreement with eligible students.






